The Sound of Music is a story of faith, hope and love. It is a story that has endured. This is the fortieth anniversary season of the musical's opening in New York. People have been uprooted, in turmoil, and slaughtered more in this century than in any other. This is a story of refugees, as was last year's production of *Fiddler on the Roof*. Whether it is the pogroms of Russia, the Anschluss in Austria, the Holocaust against the Jews of Europe, the slaughter of Christians in the Sudan or ethnic cleansing anywhere, the cruelty continues. My hope is that you will enjoy the show in this magical space and that you will take a measure of faith, hope, love and gentleness from this production back into your world. It is said, "all that is necessary for evil to triumph, is for the good to do nothing". Maria von Trapp's books are worth the read for the rest of the story. Her constant faith and great devotion inspire me.

Greg Brown is happy to be doing sound since 1973. His other credits include Civic Light Opera, Pecadillo Players, and Upstage Productions.

Michael Dunlap's foray into musical theatre started in the pit as a teenage viola player for *Fiddler*. Ten years later, he wandered onto stage as a chorus member for *Secret Garden*. The highlight was appearing as Warbucks in *Annie*. Now he tickles ivories and ebonies.

Nancy Estill's stage career has skyrocketed since dancing for the Queen of Thailand in 1967. She has taken on co-producing due to a recent mental illness and a deep and abiding love for the Forest Theater.

Lee Ann Hittenberger's Mountaineer productions date back from 1987 and include: *Little Mary Sunshine* as Mary, *Seven Brides for Seven Brothers* as Millie, and *A Midsummer Night's Dream* as Puck. Lee Ann costumes and acts in shows throughout the Northwest.

Gala Lindvall has moved from "stage Mom" to co-producing her second show with the Mountaineer Players. She loves being behind the scenes while her children and husband do the honors "on stage". Her other fun job is selling Longaberger Baskets and Pottery.

Stacey Morigeau has a BA in Drama from the University of Montana. Favorite shows worked on are *Noises Off* (U of M), *Fiddler on the Roof* (Mountaineers), *Farndale Avenue's a Christmas Carol*, *Line, Parallel Lives*, and *Talking With* (Riptide Players).

Patrick R. Neils is a producer, director, designer and actor. This is his 74th production and marks his 32nd year in theatre. He was Tevye in *Fiddler On The Roof* last year. He's a member of Taproot Theatre's Board. He loves cooking, reading, traveling, playing organ or piano and singing.

Craig Schieber has been in Mountaineer productions: *Little Mary Sunshine* as Billy and *Seven Brides for Seven Brothers* as Frank. He directed the Mountaineers *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. Craig loves teaching 8th graders at Issaquah Middle School.

Richard Stephens has designed costumes and created props for many productions in schools, churches, local amateur and semi-professional theatres. "My deep thanks to the many people who gave generously of time and talents to create the costumes for this show."

Chris Stanley is a Model Maker and ceramic artist who teaches at the Art Institute of Seattle. He appeared last year as the Rabbi in *Fiddler on the Roof*.

Cynthia Taylor is a Family Physician pinch-hitting as Prop Goddess. She and her daughter, Ariana Taylor-Stanley, played villagers in *Fiddler*.
