What an honor it is to be back directing at Kitsap Forest Theater for my second show along side an amazing staff! I am so proud to be directing one of my favorite musicals and the only show I've done three times. Based on the 1949 biography of Maria von Trapp and her family, it shows how the power of music brings together a family and a nation despite the atrocities of the Nazi regime.

My first opportunity to perform the stage version came in 1987 as Sister Berthe and then in 1998 when I was lucky to portray Maria. As an actor I researched and studied the real-life story of Maria von Trapp and her family. While the play and movie take great liberties, the heart of the story comes back to the core values of love of family, faith, music, culture and nation. It strikes at the things that matter most to people which is why we come back to this story again and again.

We are fortunate to have the chance to feature the two songs written by Richard Rodgers that were in the movie (*I Have Confidence* and *Something Good*). Those who have not seen the play version will also be happy to see that two non-singing characters in the movie (Elsa and Max) sing two songs!

Lastly, be sure to enjoy the lovely music sung by the Nuns of Nonnberg Abbey. This music was so well written that you would think it was a piece from centuries ago! It is truly my favorite part of the show – and to see and hear it here at the Kitsap Forest Theater - how lucky are we????


NEW FOR 2023 • THEATER CAMP • AUG. 7-11

BIG TREE TRAIL

One of the delights of the Mountaineers' Kitsap Forest Theater is being surrounded by the Rhododendron Preserve – a 460 acre nature conservancy with over 70 acres of old-growth forest. Ancient western red cedars abound with many other trees, ferns and wildlife. One of the biggest trees on the Kitsap Peninsula is located on the preserve. The trail to 'Big Tree' is about 1/2 mile long and starts near the historic Kitsap Cabin, ending at one of the 10 largest Douglas Fir trees in the world (2nd largest in Kitsap County). The tree itself is over 30' in diameter. The hike takes you on a bridge over Wildcat Creek with views of Hidden Valley, blooming trillium, wild rhododendrons and many other native trees and plants.

If you hike the trail after the show, please be sure your car is not blocking anyone in. Please note that the first part of the trail is steep – wear walking shoes and enjoy your trek into another time and place!

THE MOUNTAINEERS CENTENNIAL • 1923 – 2023

The rich history of The Mountaineers Players began on a Spring day in 1909 when a 'local walk' by a group of 66 hikers to view the wild blooming rhododendrons around Wildcat Lake went astray. They wandered into Hidden Valley Ranch and met Edward Paschall and family, starting a fast friendship that began one of The Mountaineers most enduring traditions.

Skits around campfires grew into a production of *Robin of Sherwood* on June 17, 1923, marking the birth of The Players who went on to produce an annual spring show every year except 4 years during World War II and 2020. A summer show was added in 2007.

The Mountaineers Players are one of the oldest, continuously operating community theater groups in the country, performing in one of the oldest outdoor theaters in North America.
