

Director's Notes

Matilda has something for everyone! It tells a compelling story of personal growth, is full of witty lines including memorable ironies and double-entendres, and features a touch of mystery to top it all off. The musical is based on a book by Roald Dahl, a children's author known for his dark tales. Dahl is often likened to a modern-day Brothers Grimm, creating stories that are both entertaining and somewhat macabre.

For example, you could compare *Matilda* to the movie *Home Alone*. In *Home Alone*, a young boy uses his ingenuity to outsmart a pair of bumbling burglars. In *Matilda*, Matilda Wormwood uses her intelligence, telekinetic powers, and cleverness to navigate the oppressive environment created by her cruel parents and the tyrannical Miss Trunchbull. Both stories center on children overcoming challenges posed by unsympathetic adults.

Matilda devises several devious pranks to humiliate her father, and with her classmates, she carries out clever tricks to subvert the oppressive control of Miss Trunchbull. Matilda not only asserts herself but also helps those around her to embrace their inner strength. Most importantly, Matilda learns that her efforts to set things right aren't about revenge, but about creating a better world.

The humor in *Matilda* is abundant and varied. There's broad humor, like Mr. Wormwood's green hair, and clever wordplay, such as the title of the song *Revoltin' Children*. The double meaning is clear: when children are revolting, they are rebelling against authority, but when you are annoyed with them, they can also be described as "revolting." Finally, Matilda has a gift for storytelling, with her tales sometimes blurring the lines between reality and imagination. Pay close attention to her story about the acrobat and the escapologist.

I conclude by noting the wonderful music and choreography in the show, delivered by our talented multi-age cast. Everyone is delightfully costumed in '70s chic, and the set design is vibrant and creative. All this takes place in our beautiful forest theater, adding to the magic of the production.

The Crucible by Arthur Miller is a classic play that delves into the Salem witch trials of 1692. 
ANNOUNCING OUR 2025 SEASON!

THE MOUNTAINEERS PLAYERS HISTORY • 1923-2024

The rich history of The Mountaineers Players began on a Spring day in 1909 when a 'local walk' by a group of 66 hikers to view the wild blooming rhododendrons around Wildcat Lake went astray. They wandered into Hidden Valley Ranch and met Edward Paschall and family, starting a fast friendship that began one of The Mountaineers most enduring traditions.

Skits around campfires grew into a production of *Robin of Sherwood* on June 17, 1923, performed in the woods going from glade to glade with the audience following along. Realizing the need for a permanent theater, Bill Darling and volunteers built the outdoor amphitheater in 1925-1926. This marked the birth of The Players who went on to produce an annual spring show every year except 4 years during World War II and 2020. A summer show was added in 2007.

The Mountaineers Players are one of the oldest, continuously operating community theater groups in the country, performing in one of the oldest outdoor theaters in North America. BIG TREE TRAIL

One of the delights of the Mountaineers' Kitsap Forest Theater is being surrounded by the Rhododendron Preserve – a 460 acre nature conservancy with over 70 acres of old-growth forest. Ancient western red cedars abound with many other trees, ferns and wildlife. One of the biggest trees on the Kitsap Peninsula is located on the preserve. The trail to 'Big Tree' is about 1/2 mile long and starts near the historic Kitsap Cabin, ending at one of the 10 largest Douglas Fir trees in the world (2nd largest in Kitsap County). The tree itself is over 30' in diameter. The hike takes you on a bridge over Wildcat Creek with views of Hidden Valley, blooming trillium, wild rhododendrons and many other native trees and plants.

If you hike the trail after the show, please be sure your car is not blocking anyone in. Please note that the first part of the trail is steep – wear walking shoes and enjoy your trek into another time and place!
