

## Director's Notes

Here's a heads-up for our audience: *Big Fish* is bursting with fantastical storytelling—tales that are wild, whimsical, and sometimes delightfully over-the-top. Larger-than-life characters appear, timelines blur, and settings shift in magical and unexpected ways. The story doesn't unfold in a straight line; instead, we glimpse people at different stages of life, like pieces of a puzzle gradually falling into place.

And here's another heads-up: you just might shed some tears. At the heart of this musical is a father, Edward, confronting his mortality after a cancer diagnosis. His son, Will—on the verge of marriage and fatherhood—sets out to understand the truth behind his father's larger-than-life stories before it's too late. Their wives, Sandra and Josephine, offer love and insight, grounding the journey in real emotion. These are the characters' challenges, but through their stories, you may find reflections of your own. As Edward shows us, no moment is ordinary when we recognize the magic in the breath of life.

How can such fantastical storytelling and deeply emotional themes share the same stage? That may be the message of *Big Fish* itself: that life, in all its chaos, wonder, and sorrow, is a mystery worth embracing. As we face our dragons, follow our better angels, and live with courage and heart, may grace guide us—and may we each become the hero of our story.




#### THE MOUNTAINEERS PLAYERS HISTORY • 1923-2025

The rich history of The Mountaineers Players began on a Spring day in 1909 when a 'local walk' by a group of 66 hikers to view the wild blooming rhododendrons around Wildcat Lake went astray. They wandered into Hidden Valley Ranch and met Edward Paschall and family, starting a fast friendship that began one of The Mountaineers most enduring traditions.

Skits around campfires grew into a production of *Robin of Sherwood* on June 17, 1923, performed in the woods going from glade to glade with the audience following along. Realizing the need for a permanent theater, Bill Darling and volunteers built the outdoor amphitheater in 1925-1926. This marked the birth of The Players who went on to produce an annual spring show every year except 4 years during World War II and 2020. A summer show was added in 2007 and a fall show in 2024.

The Mountaineers Players are one of the oldest, continuously operating community theater groups in the country, performing in one of the oldest outdoor theaters in North America. 



### BIG TREE TRAIL

The Kitsap Forest Theater is surrounded by the Rhododendron Preserve – a 460 acre nature conservancy with over 70 acres of old-growth forest. One of the 10 largest Douglas Fir trees in the world (2<sup>nd</sup> largest in Kitsap County) is located on the preserve. The trail to 'Big Tree' is about 1/2 mile long and starts near Kitsap Cabin, ending at Big Tree. The tree is over 30' in diameter. The first part of the trail is steep – the hike takes you through Hidden Valley, on a bridge over Wildcat Creek with views of blooming trillium, wild rhododendrons and other native trees and plants.

If you hike the trail after the show, please be sure your car is not blocking anyone in. Wear walking shoes and enjoy your trek to another time and place!
